Northrop Grumman Awarded U.S. Navy Contract for Foreign Military Sales Support

RESTON, Va., Oct. 1, 2007 (PRIME NEWSWIRE) -- Northrop Grumman Corporation (NYSE:NOC) was recently awarded a contract by the U.S. Navy to provide [management](#) and technical support for foreign military sales (FMS). The contract has a potential total value of more than \$43 million, if all options are exercised.

FMS is a government-to-government program for selling defense equipment, services and [training](#) that furthers national security and foreign policy objectives.

The firm-fee, fixed-price contract - officially called Team Ships, Program/Project Management, Surface (PMS) 326 Professional Services/Program and Financial Management and Engineering Services - was awarded by Naval Sea Systems Command (NAVSEA) under the SeaPort-e contract vehicle. It includes one base year valued at \$10 million, which could be extended up to three years, bringing the potential total value to more than \$43 million. Northrop Grumman and its team will provide FMS case management, [project management](#) and technical support for ships and ship systems for the PMS 326 office.

"Northrop Grumman is a world leader in FMS support, and our world-class team has a long history of supporting our NAVSEA FMS efforts," said Larry Peters, senior program manager for international security assistance programs for Northrop Grumman. "We are pleased to continue this very important [partnership](#) with Team Ships, PMS 326 and to support their mission of providing combat-ready ships and stations to the world's fleet."

More than 28 percent of the work will be performed by [small business](#), contributing to NAVSEA's SeaPort-e small business goals.
